

GETS 20 YEARS FOR HOLD-UP

Youth Who Figured in Fatal Robbery of Club Sentenced.

A sentence of from twenty to forty years in State's prison was imposed by Judge Bertini in General Sessions yesterday on Thomas Reggione, 21 years old, of 9 Morton Street, on his plea of guilty last July to a hold-up charge.

Reggione and three other gunmen shot two patrons of the Triangle Club at 29 Carmine Street on the night of last March 19, when they obtained \$2,000 and some jewelry from the proprietor, Charles Quirico. As the gunmen were about to leave, Detective James Rogers ran in to arrest them.

In an exchange of shots, the detective shot and killed one of the robbers, Albert Morino, and captured Reggione and Pasquale De Palo, who is awaiting trial. The two wounded patrons recovered. The police still are seeking the fourth gunman.
